What's New

Here is just a glimpse of some of the new functionality found on the MyFireCommunity website:

- Ability for each neighborhood group to set up its own custom home page, calendar and discussion topics with attached documents
- New option to send email automatically, after every posting or just once each day if there was any new discussion
- Supports both public and private content for the same neighborhood group
- Supports keyword searches within public neighborhood groups
- Faster, simpler account setup
- Invite non-members to your neighborhood via email address; Email invitation includes a link to create the account and go directly to the neighborhood
- Share documents up to 50Mb per file
- Usability improvements throughout
- Better integration with the Lessons Learned Center library
