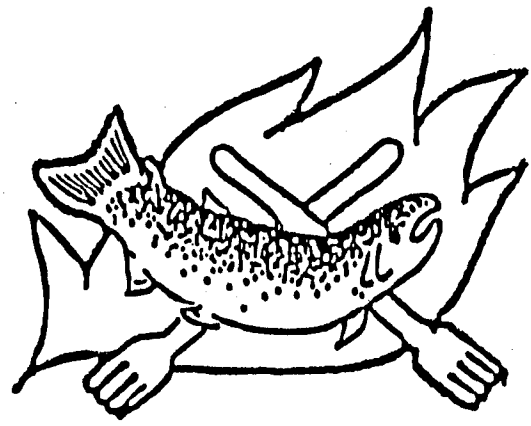

IT'S A YAWNER...Very few people cared what we name the bridge at Johnson Creek. Frankly, my dear, neither do we.

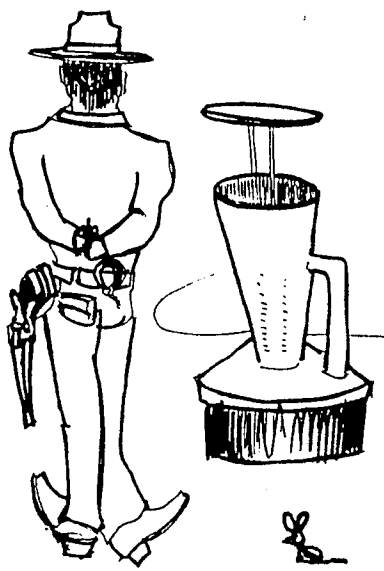
FIREFIGHTERS are always in heat. Or so the saying goes. Unless they're in Idaho. See related story on the back page.

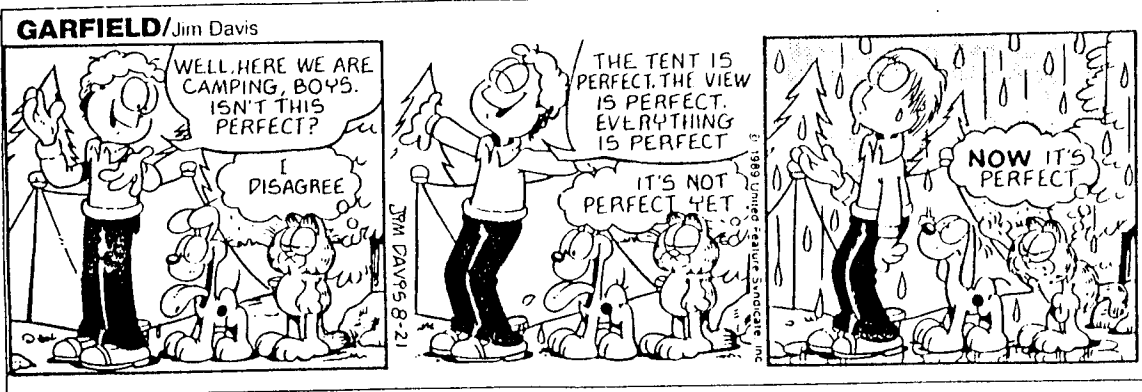
## Screen characters' secret confessions

## Twin Cities tops for tots

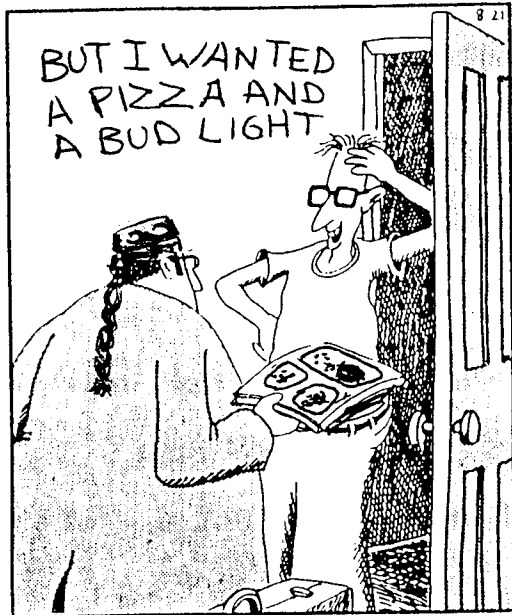
Minneapolis-St. Paul is the USA's best major metropolitan area for raising children and Miami is the worst, says a study in the September issue of Savvy Magazine.

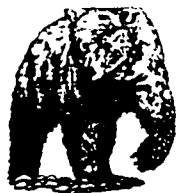

The Clover-Mist Fire was contained at 2000 last night! Four crews were demobed today leaving about 600 folks left in camp. Cost to date is \$22,517,594 with 100 acres actively burning. Rehab efforts continue on schedule with the completion of the project planned for Friday.

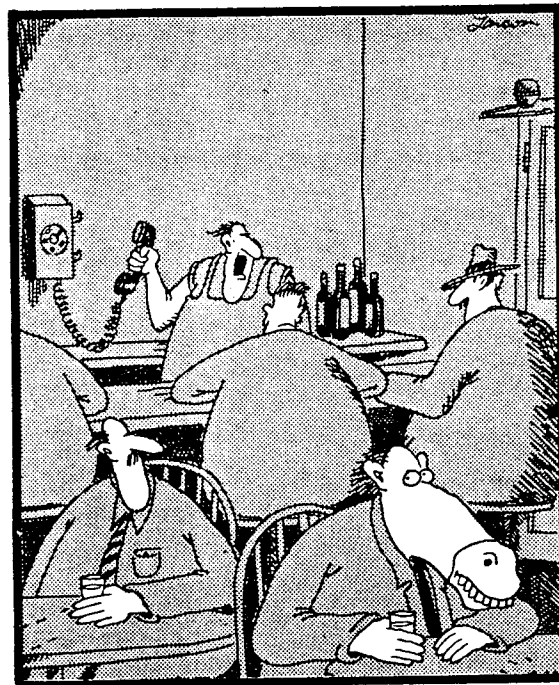

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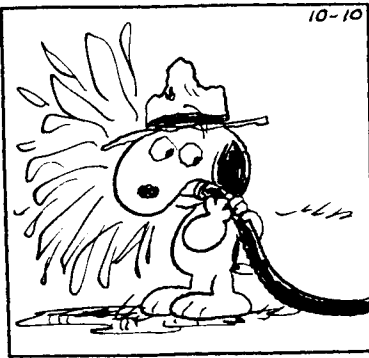

In the Shelter in Buffalo

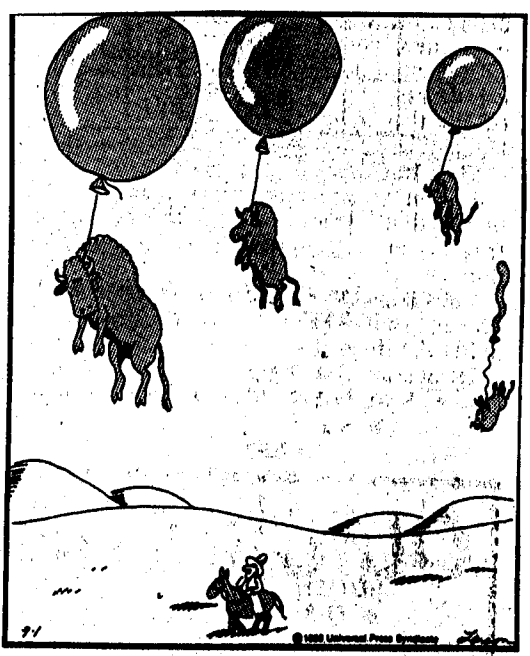
Dear Sheltered,
