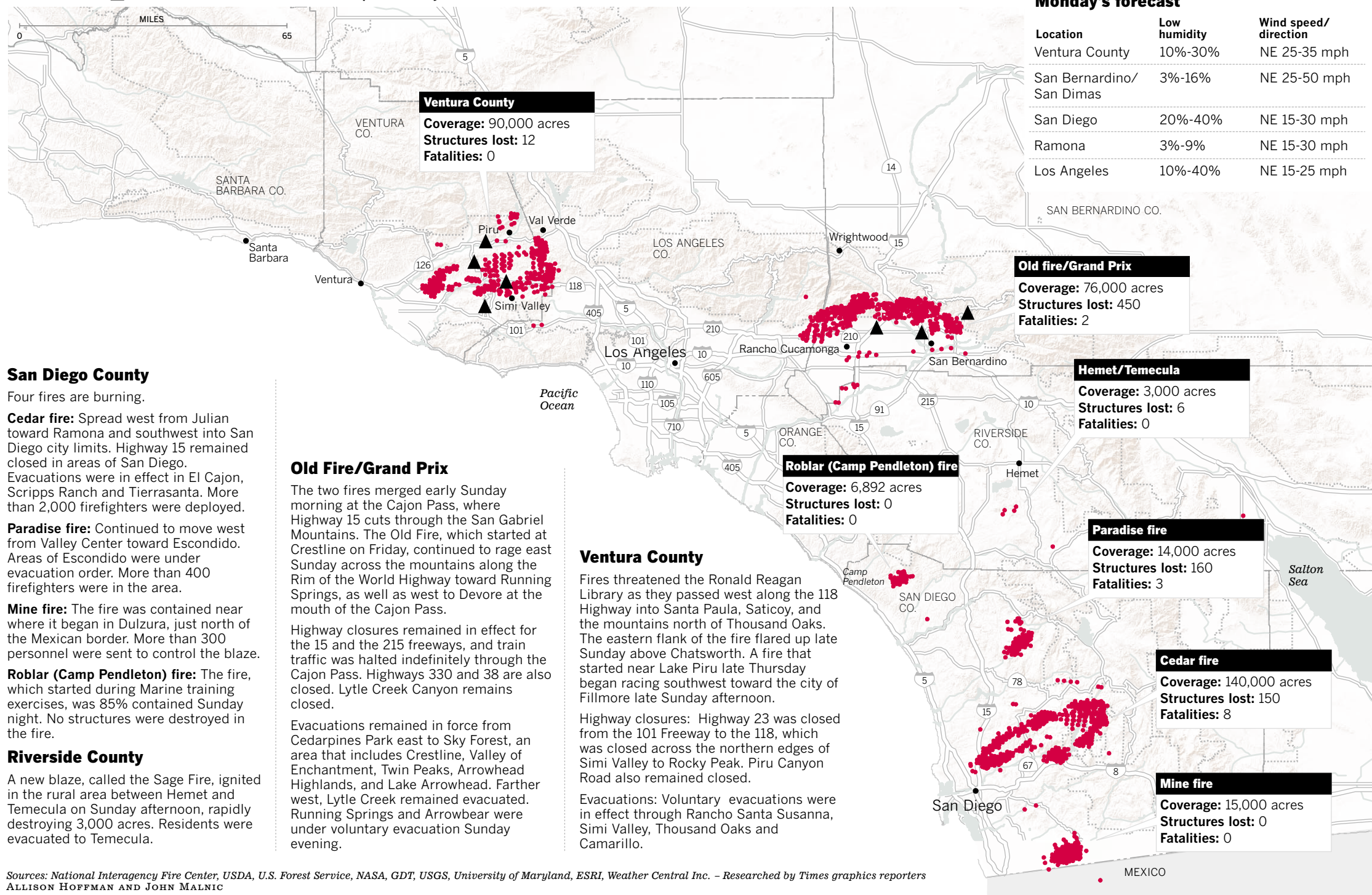


# Southern California on fire

## San Diego County

Four fires are burning.

**Cedar fire:** Spread west from Julian toward Ramona and southwest into San Diego city limits. Highway 15 remained closed in areas of San Diego. Evacuations were in effect in El Cajon, Scripps Ranch and Tierrasanta. More than 2,000 firefighters were deployed.

**Paradise fire:** Continued to move west from Valley Center toward Escondido. Areas of Escondido were under evacuation order. More than 400 firefighters were in the area.

**Mine fire:** The fire was contained near where it began in Dulzura, just north of the Mexican border. More than 300 personnel were sent to control the blaze.

**Roblar (Camp Pendleton) fire:** The fire, which started during Marine training exercises, was 85% contained Sunday night. No structures were destroyed in the fire.

## Riverside County

A new blaze, called the Sage Fire, ignited in the rural area between Hemet and Temecula on Sunday afternoon, rapidly destroying 3,000 acres. Residents were evacuated to Temecula.

## Old Fire/Grand Prix

The two fires merged early Sunday morning at the Cajon Pass, where Highway 15 cuts through the San Gabriel Mountains. The Old Fire, which started at Crestline on Friday, continued to rage east Sunday across the mountains along the Rim of the World Highway toward Running Springs, as well as west to Devore at the mouth of the Cajon Pass.

Highway closures remained in effect for the 15 and the 215 freeways, and train traffic was halted indefinitely through the Cajon Pass. Highways 330 and 38 are also closed. Lytle Creek Canyon remains closed.

Evacuations remained in force from Cedarpines Park east to Sky Forest, an area that includes Crestline, Valley of Enchantment, Twin Peaks, Arrowhead Highlands, and Lake Arrowhead. Farther west, Lytle Creek remained evacuated. Running Springs and Arrowbear were under voluntary evacuation Sunday evening.

## Ventura County

Fires threatened the Ronald Reagan Library as they passed west along the 118 Highway into Santa Paula, Saticoy, and the mountains north of Thousand Oaks. The eastern flank of the fire flared up late Sunday above Chatsworth. A fire that started near Lake Piru late Thursday began racing southwest toward the city of Fillmore late Sunday afternoon.

Highway closures: Highway 23 was closed from the 101 Freeway to the 118, which was closed across the northern edges of Simi Valley to Rocky Peak. Piru Canyon Road also remained closed.

Evacuations: Voluntary evacuations were in effect through Rancho Santa Susanna, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks and Camarillo.
